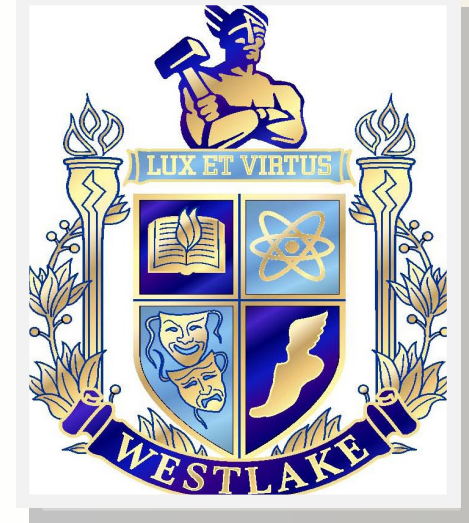

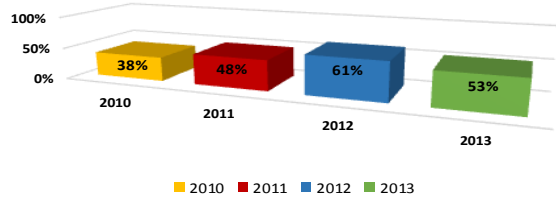
Vision Statement: Westlake High School will be an academy for the fostering of knowledge and skill mastery guided by creative thought.

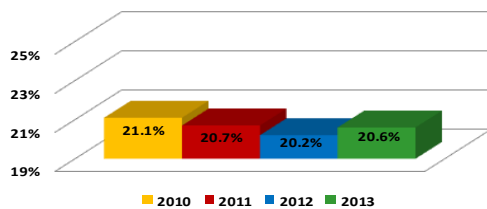
Advanced Placement Tests

Overall Percentage



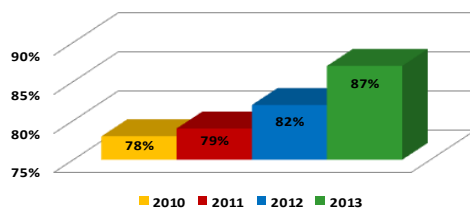

Westlake increased its graduation rate in 2013 by 5%, as our School Improvement Plan (SIP) indicates. Students have the ability to participate in our Eastshore Center, which aids students with earning credit if they are behind. 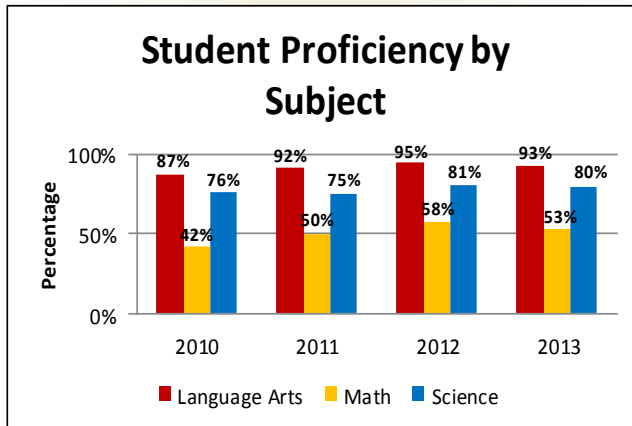
Trustlands Accounting

The Westlake High Community serves the students of Eagle Mountain, Saratoga Springs, Cedar Fort and Fairfield. The Eagle Mountain/Saratoga Springs area combined has an estimated population of 50,000 residents and is continually increasing each year. There are two middle schools (grades 7, 8, 9) and ten elementary schools that feed Westlake High.

Westlake High School

Westlake High School was established in 2009. Since its opening, it has been accredited through the Northwest Accreditation Commission. The school operates on a quarter system with 180 days of classroom instruction per year. There are 100 certified faculty members, five counselors, four assistant principals and one principal.

WHS School/Community Council

Westlake's School/Community Council consists of parents, faculty and administrators. Principal Openshaw is the administrative member of our council; Audrey Barton is the District representative. Staff and teachers include Trevor Schramm, Adam Bennion, Caleb Miller, and Natalie Clark; parents include Todd Abney, Lynne Benham, John Festin, Nicolette Fike, Tani Ireland, Leslie Jones, Kim Moir, Ryan Tyson and Angela Webb, with Ryon Tyson serving as the Committee chairperson. The Council meets monthly to create a School Improvement Plan and oversee the Trust Land money.

School Grading

Utah schools received their report cards on 9/3/2013 with the release of new school grades based on proficiency in language arts, mathematics and science, and the growth students demonstrated year over year on end-of-level testing. The grades were given in compliance with a law enacted by the Utah Legislature in 2011 and modified in 2013. Westlake High School received a B grade.
