

# Projected Growth Accommodations for 2018-2019

## 1 Westlake Will Add Five Additional Classrooms

- Rearrange existing classrooms, which will free up two rooms for new personnel.
- Convert an existing computer room into a classroom.
- Convert the Lecture Hall into a room capable of housing two classes that will be co-taught by two teachers.

## 2 Offer Early Morning Classes to Alleviate Classroom Use During the Day

- Early Morning classes will be taught Monday through Thursday and will run 60 minutes in length.
- Potential classes may be offered: Secondary 3 Math, Concurrent Enrollment
- Math 1010/1050, AP English Literature, Agriculture Leadership.
- Additional Early Morning classes are under consideration.

## 3 Provide Co-Taught Classes to Maximize Teacher-Student Interactions

- Co-taught classes will be facilitate din the Lecture Hall.
- Proposed co-taught classes include AP Calculus, Sports Conditioning, AP English Language, Journalism/Video Production, US History, and Current Events.
- Additional co-taught classes are being reviewed.

## 4 Expand Lunch Serving and Eating Areas

- Additional tables and chairs will be supplied by ASD.
- Current lunch schedule of three periods will continue; however, a fourth lunch period has been developed and will be implemented if needed.

## 5 Provide Technology Support

- ASD committed to provide an additional portable computer lab with 40 computers and charging cart.

## 6 Maintain the Commitment to Use Student Advocates and Teacher Mentor Coaches.



## 7 Counselors Review With Current Students the Following:

- Off-Campus experiences, including MTECH courses and Distance On-line classes.
- Early Graduation
- Internships
- Modified schedules

## 8 Upgrade the Distance Learning Center and Credit Recovery Center

- Accommodate additional students.
- Provide additional support with staffing needs.
