



Trustlands Accounting



Westlake High School was established in 2009. Since its opening, it has been accredited through Northwest Association of Schools and Colleges. The school operates on a quarter system with 180 days of classroom instruction per year. There are 100 certified faculty members, 6 counselors, four assistant principals and one principal.
