

ADVANCED PLACEMENT TESTS



Advanced Placement (AP) courses which were offered in 2013-14 were Spanish, Art/Drawing 2-D, Calculus, Statistics, Music Theory, Biology, Chemistry, Physics, Government & Politics, US History, Human Geography, Psychology, English Literature and English.

CONCURRENT ENROLLMENT

Westlake High School offers a number of concurrent credits through Utah Valley University. They include: Technical Design, Interior Design, College Writing, ProStart, College Prep Math, Precalculus and Spanish 4. The number of students taking these classes continue to increase as we grow. This is a great way to earn college credit while attending high school classes.



Beginning in 2011, all juniors had the opportunity to take the ACT test, therefore, the number of students increases each year. Although we have a large number of students taking the test, we are meeting the state average, which is 20.8%.

EXTRA-CURRICULAR ACCOMPLISHMENTS

ATHLETIC AWARDS: Awards went to the following: Boys Cross-Country finished 2nd in State. Wrestling finished 15th in State, and a State Champ in the 100 Butterfly (Swimming). We also received several academic All-State team winners as well as several individual state placers and accomplishments.

PERFORMING ARTS: The WHS Thunder Marching Band once again, brought home the 1st place 4A trophy. Our drama received the State Champions in the "One Act" play, and dance company finished 2nd at the Shakespeare Festival.

CTE: The DECA club finished 2nd in Accounting at the State Competition and the FBLA finished in the top 10. We received two 1st place FCCLA winners at Nationals and our ProStart team finished 4th and 5th at state. Our FFA was recognized as a 5-Star Chapter and placed 2nd in the Chapter display records contest, HOSA received State Leadership Recognition awards ranging from 2nd - 8th place.

For the 2nd year in a row, Westlake High School was named and recognized as the "Cool School of the Week" by Fox 13.



Westlake increased its graduation rate in 2014 by 2%, as our School Improvement Plan (SIP) states. Students have the ability to participate in our Eastshore Center, which aids students with earning credit if they are behind. In addition, over 3.5 million dollars in scholarship money was awarded to the class of 2014!

WESTLAKE HIGH SCHOOL

Westlake High School was established in 2009. Since its opening, it has been accredited through the Northwest Accreditation Commission. The school operates on a quarter system with 180 days of classroom instruction per year. There are 100 certified faculty members, six counselors, five assistant principals, and one principal.

WHS COMMUNITY

The Westlake High Community serves the students of Eagle Mountain, Saratoga Springs, Cedar Fort and Fairfield. The Eagle Mountain/Saratoga Springs area combined has an estimated population of 50,000 residents and is continually increasing each year. There are two middle schools (grades 7,8,9) and ten elementary schools that feed Westlake High.
