They will help these students by monitoring their progress toward graduation by focusing on attendance, grades, parental involvement, and teacher-student relationships. These advocates will be paid from Trustlands Funds.

2. Two aides will be hired to assist students in the Credit Recovery Center. They will help students with online courses, proctor student testing, and monitor their progress. Both aides will be paid from Trustlands Funds.

3. 14 teacher preparatory periods will be purchased to reduce class sizes, thus increasing the opportunity for more one-to-one interactions between teacher and student. A smaller teacher:student ratio will also allow more time for teachers to work with parents. These preparatory periods will be paid from Trustlands Funds.

4. 1 FTE will be purchased to hire a SPED teacher to help the department lower class sizes and reduce the number of student files each teacher holds. This will be paid from TSSA.
